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# HOW DOES EASY JOB BRIDGE WORK?

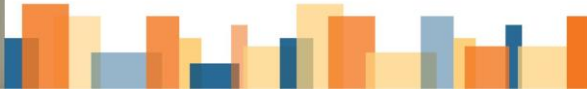

- **CV and Cover Letter**

There are **no minimum** number of applications and they need to be submitted **8 weeks prior to arrival**.

A **feasibility check** is done to evaluate whether the internship will be possible.

The students' profile, skills and experience are then matched with a host company in our **vast network of local host companies**.

# HOST COMPANIES

- Working hours will be a max of 35 - 40 hours per week, depending on industry.
- Break time to be given to students.

- Most companies are in accessible locations but the locations can vary.

# — ON ARRIVAL



Students are welcomed by our driver Mario, or one of his drivers, and they are taken to their accommodation.

They will be given a welcome pack which will have:

- Keys to their accommodation
- A copy of the apartment rules
- Envelope for their apartment deposit

# ON THEIR FIRST DAY

Students are welcomed at our offices for their welcome meeting.

They are given information about the accommodation, health centres and how to use our emergency phone.

They are then accompanied to their workplace to introduce them to their mentors, and provide them with directions to their workplace.

# BEFORE THEY LEAVE

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Before they go back home, students have a closing meeting where they receive:

- Students also get a **certificate** from Easy Job Bridge to commemorate their time in Malta.
- Information about **Transfer** from the accommodation to the airport.
- **Recommendation letters** can be requested from the mentor at the host company





# Malta: The Host Country





- English is one of our two **official languages**
- Malta has a **rich history and culture** because of its location, ready to be explored
- We have amazing food **bursting with Mediterranean flavours**

## Time Zone

- Our time zone is very similar to all European countries, the clock is changed forward on the last Sunday of March and back on the last Sunday of October.
- GMT +01:00 Central European

## Area Code & Wifi

- The Country Code is **+356** the Outgoing Code is **00** followed by the country code of the international number you wish to dial.
- WIFI is widely available, either through mobile network data plans or through hotel/restaurant/cafe Wi-Fi or public Wi-Fi hotspots

## Electricity Voltage

- The electrical supply is 230 volts /- 10%. The frequency of the supply is 50 hertz.
- The three-pin rectangular plug system is used.
- Adapters are very easy to find.

**Water** : Tap water is not recommended to drink (an issue of taste rather of health). Local and imported bottled mineral water is available from shops, supermarkets, restaurants and bars.



- The Maltese currency is the EURO.
- There are a number of ATM machines from which you can withdraw money at any time.
- Several banks (HSBC, BOV, APS and BNF Bank being the major ones) are located in the various localities and several ATMs are situated around commercial and tourist areas. **Cards accepted** are generally those connected to international networks Cirrus and Maestro and popularly used credit cards such as VISA, Mastercard and American Express are widely accepted (by banks and retail establishments alike).

# CURRENCY, BANKS, ATMS

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The local's behaviour and conduct comes full of surprises. In general Maltese people are welcoming and friendly.

Personality is shaped from family-status, knowledge, age, and social connections which reflect on who you know, so having a good reputation is very important for the average Maltese person.

## MALTESE PEOPLE



**Maltese people range from reserved and polite to warm and expressive.**

Social Life plays a big role, people enjoy spending money dining out in one of the many new international restaurants available around the island.

Travelling abroad, Clubbing, Football, Shopping, Swimming & Sunbathing, Family & Friends gatherings, Grilling 'Pink' BBQ Sausages on the beach, Market stalls, Food & Wine are certainly a major part of the Maltese Culture.







- The only type of public transport in Malta is a system of route buses.
- The bus routes, operated by **Malta Public Transport** can get you anywhere you want to go between **5:30am and 11:00pm**. A night service runs on Friday and Saturday nights and on public holidays.

- You can also use mobile phone application taxi services such as Bolt and Uber, which are available 24/7. And of course we also have local Maltese taxi options too.

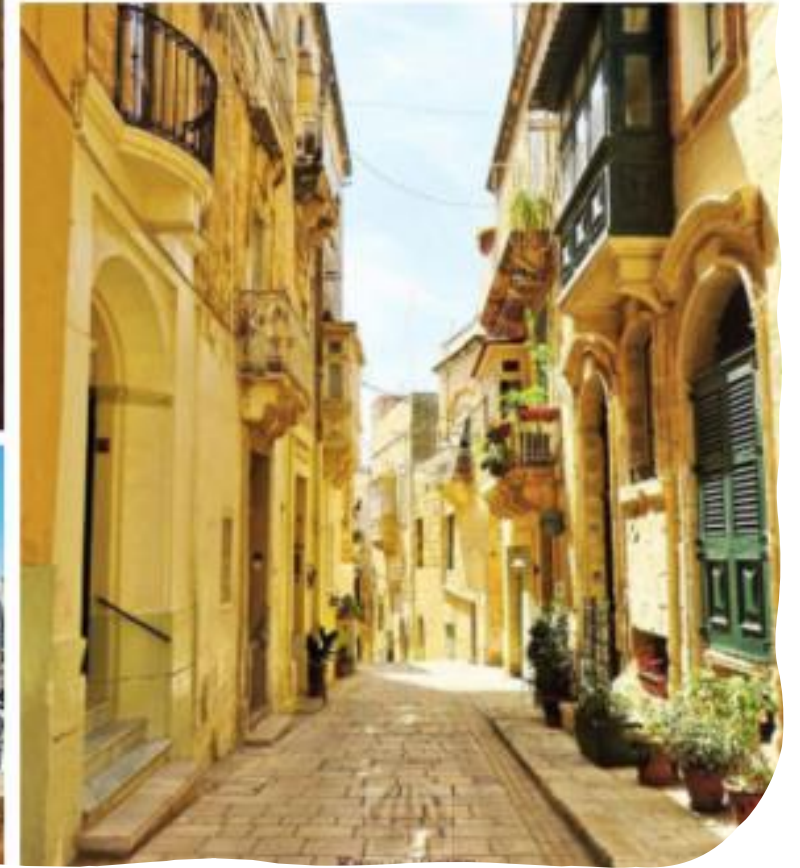
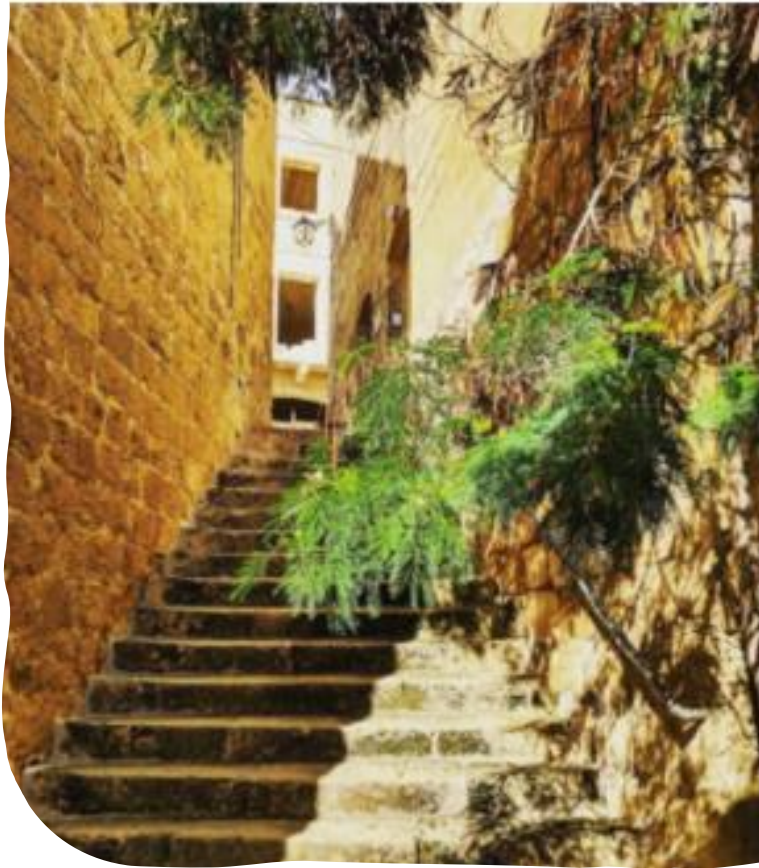




# How big is Malta?

- The Island State of Malta is one of the world's smallest Independent Country (27km long and 14.5km wide) In fact, it is the smallest member of the European Union.
- However, it is the eighth most densely populated country in the world. Lots of people like living here! Population Size Over 425,394.





There are 54 Cities, Towns and Villages in Malta and 14 in Gozo. Tourism is the biggest “bread winner” for the Island with more than 2.3 million holidaymakers per year.





**Average annual temperature:**

23 °C during the day and 16 °C at night

**Average annual sea temperature:** 20 °C

**Coldest month:** January, with average temperatures of 15 °C

**Warmest month:** August, with average temperatures of 31 °C

## CLIMATE



The Maltese Islands have a sunny climate with a daily average of 12 hours of sunshine in summer and 5-6 hours in mid-winter.

From May till October, you will only need very light, cool clothes while November, December, March & April may require a bit more warmth and a windproof jacket.

**WARNING** January and February are extremely humid months, a thick warm jacket is beneficial more indoors than outdoors as Maltese houses are built with Limestone or Bricks and it feels much colder inside due to the humid.

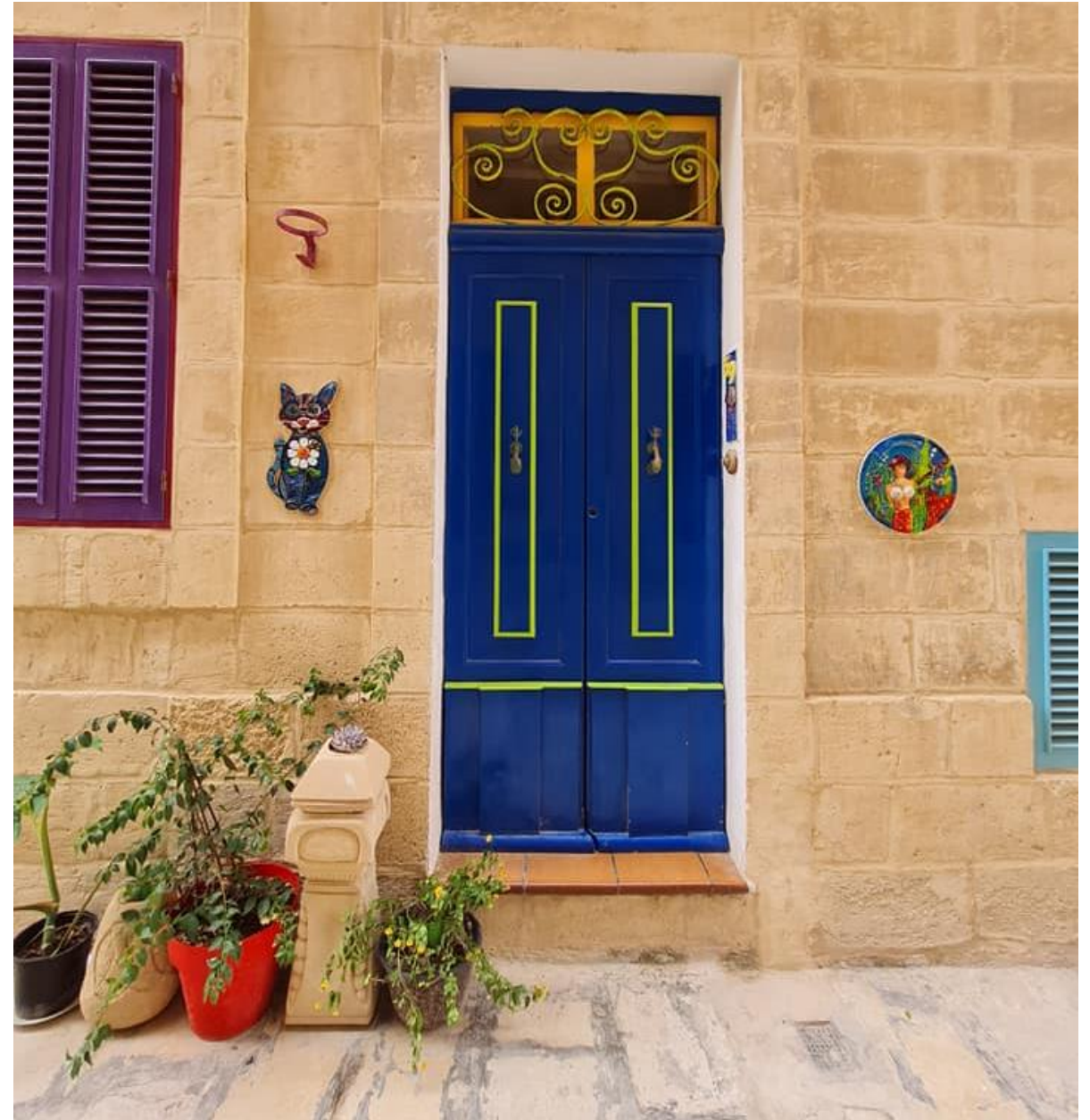

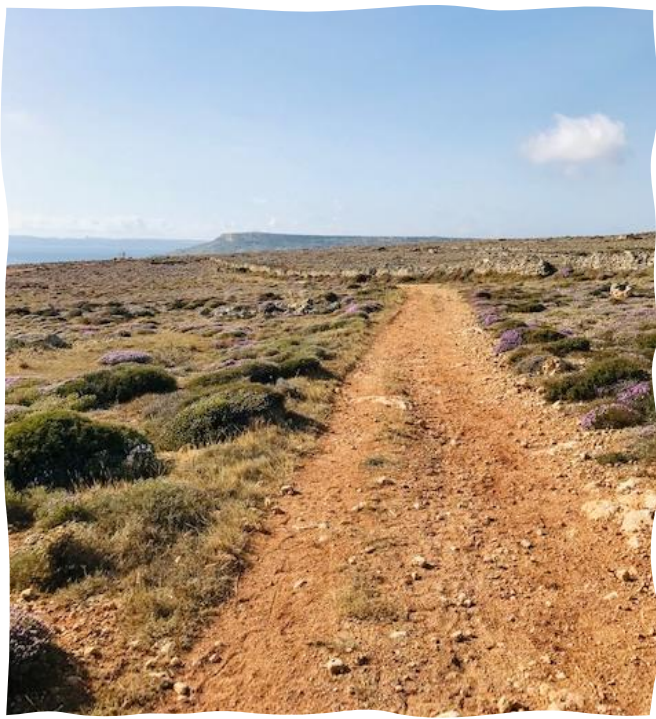

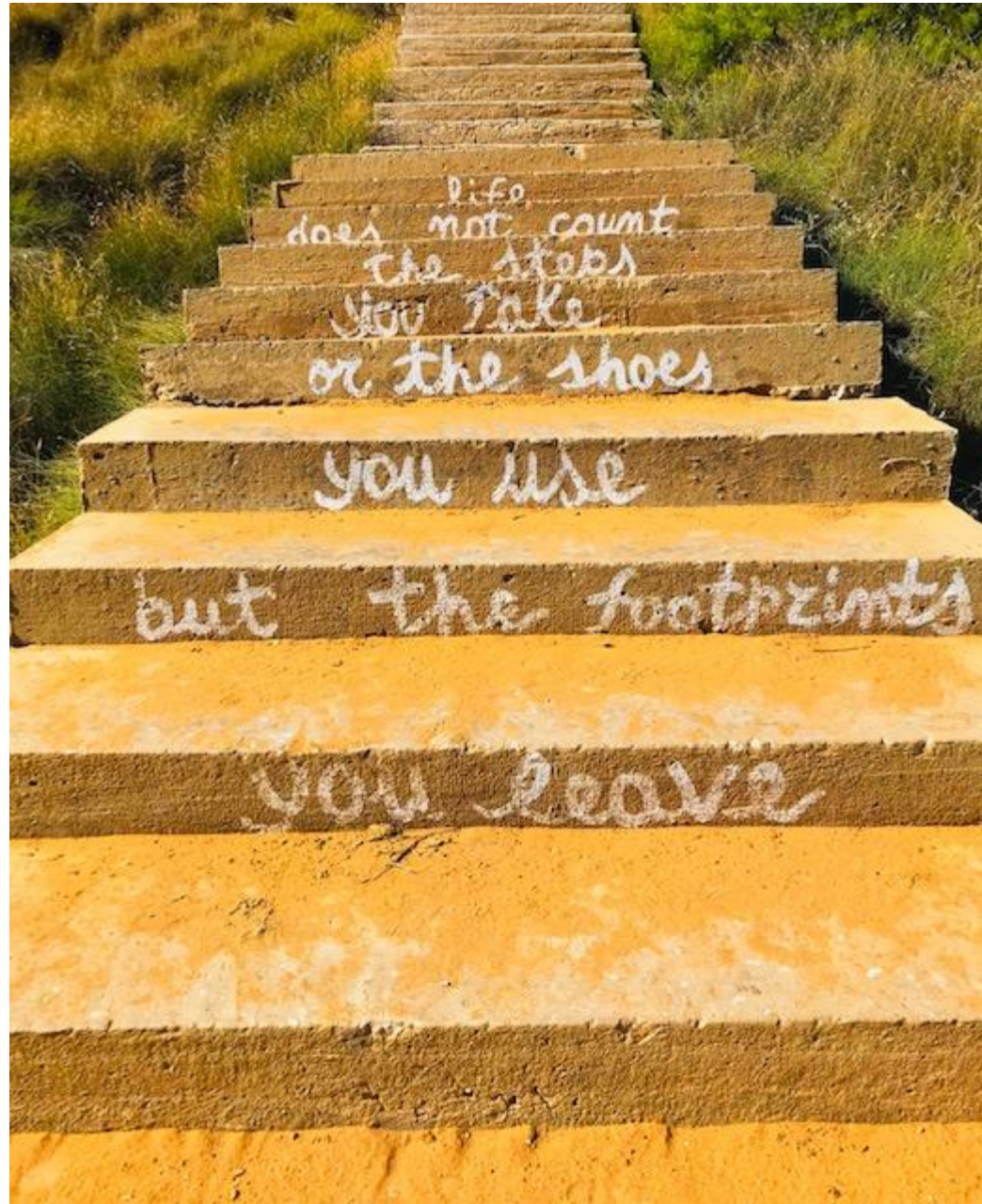

## OTHER MUST VISITS ....

Popeye Village has grown from its days as the 1980's film set to one of Malta's major tourist attractions.

Anchor Bay is also a must visit for a snorkel in deep blue water. Squid and Octopus tend to be spotted in this location.



# MDINA

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Mdina is a **fortified medieval** town enclosed in bastions, located on a large hill in the centre of **Malta**. This was the old capital of Malta, and with its narrow streets, few inhabitants and beautiful views over the Island it is truly a magical town. Mdina is referred to as the "**Silent City**" by Maltese and visitors alike.







# San Anton Garden

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The most beautiful out of the few public parks in Malta.

They surround an ornate palazzo built by Grand Master of the Knights of St John, Antoine de Paule, as his summer residence in 1636.

It is now the official residence of the Maltese President, and gardens are open to the public.





# ZURRIEQ

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One of the oldest towns in Malta; here you can find ancient pottery, the Punic Tower, and Catacombs amongst others.

Structures from the 15th and 16th century are spread across the town but Żurrieq is also famous for its beach and;

- **The Blue Grotto.**

You can be taken here on tiny colourful wooden boats





# ST. PETERS POOL

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The sea is crystal clear with an amazing azure and light green colors and offers amazing snorkeling opportunities.

The flat rocks provide perfect sunbathing areas, and the high rocks offer some shade from the strong sun.

Due to its remote location and bad roads leading there it's rarely ever crowded, and you can always find a spot just for yourself.

There is a ladder to come back up. Take Water and food as there are no shops around.







## MARSAXLOKK

The village is known for the mainly large fresh fish market which takes place along the seafront on Sundays, and a tourist market during all other days of the week.




# IS MALTA SAFE?

- The short answer is YES. Malta is much safer than many other holiday destinations in Europe.
- Crime rates in Malta are relatively low. Overall crime rates are well below the EU average.
- Walking outside at night is perfectly safe almost everywhere in Malta.

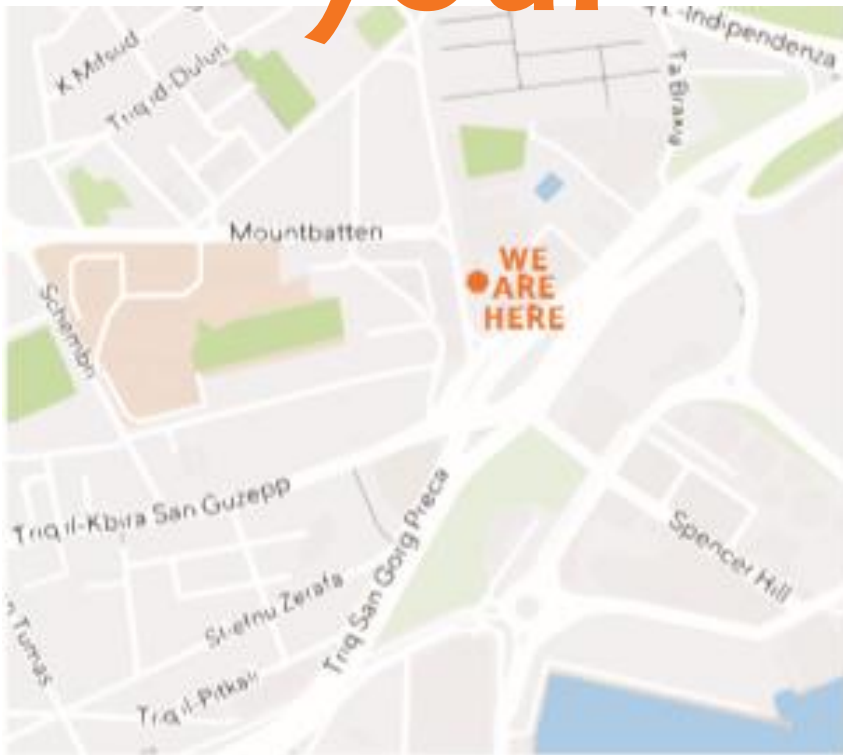
## CONCLUSION
